

According to the results of the 2017 survey of ATE grantees, 29 percent of students in ATE-supported programs in 2016 were women.^a By discipline, the percentage of women ranged from 12 to 56 percent.



^a Eighty-four percent of 250 ATE grant recipients completed this survey. Of these 210 respondents, 117 reported that their ATE grants supported instructional programs; 115 provided information about the gender of their students. Sixteen projects reported students with an unknown gender, for a total of 1,930 students. These students are not represented in the graph above.
