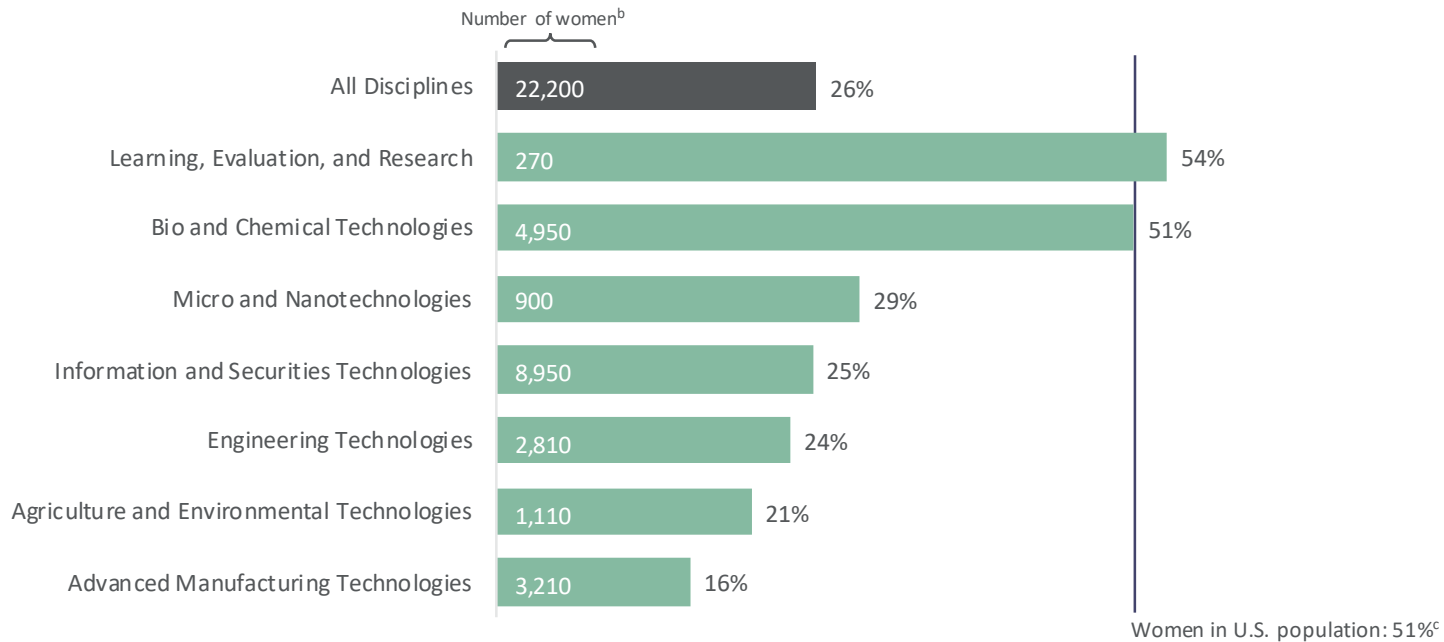




# Women Students in ATE: 2017

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According to the results of the 2018 survey of ATE grantees, 26 percent of students in ATE-supported programs in 2017 were women.<sup>a</sup> By discipline, the percentage of women ranged from 16 to 54 percent.



<sup>a</sup> Ninety percent of 276 ATE grant recipients completed this survey. Of these 248 respondents, 141 reported that their ATE grants supported instructional programs; 139 provided information about the gender of their students. Thirty-five projects reported 13,610 students with an unknown gender. These students are not represented in the graph above.
